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4.00	CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT The Chairman continues in close negotiations with Robert Smith of Defence Estates and Peter Ambrose of Naval Estates. Negotiations continue with Richard Parkes, of MCA Defence Estates and SEEDA regarding fencing. Preferably to be deferred until our boundaries are established. Peter Ambrose is also involved. Affordability remains the key question and the production of a business plan is essential. There is also the question of maintenance. Unless firm plans are in place we will be confronted with hangar rental of £120k. Next year. We should aim for a five year plan. The URD needs to be completed by the 25 th July. Naval Estates and Defence Estates need to have justification for the 'Buy Back' and financial support. Hangar maintenance could be a problem the Club have been doing such work as has been required since 1995 and this should continue. The business plan should reflect this and the RNGSA may be able to assist. It remains to be seen whether we become part of a Service Unit. It may be that Trustees will be required to secure Service funds but the question of our security of tenure is crucial. We may have access to surplus Service equipment. Service personnel recruitment into the Club remains a priority. Our plans for the purchase of a Duo Discus remain on track.
