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CHAIRMAN'S POINTS 4 The Chairman reported that: Confirmation of charity status for PNGC has just been received. This is a major achievement after nearly two years work. This change of status will bring with it a number of significant issues, many of which have been anticipated and worked on over recent months. Some of the issues will include the setting up of the management structure of the PNGC Charity with a new Constitution and the appointment of new Trustees, and the formation of a new PNGC trading company with its own Board of Directors, to which the existing Committee will report biennially on operational issues. The future relationship between the charity and the trading elements of PNGC is particularly challenging from the financial viewpoint, including the transfer of assets following an audit in September, but confirmation of the new status will allow meaningful business plans to be developed. The Chairman warned that with the recent and ongoing changes to the ownership of the airfield it is possible that rents could increase so provision will need to be made for such eventualities. The receipt of charity status will allow RN Estates to instruct Defence Estates to renew the PNGC licence, a particularly important requirement. The Chairman also thanked Tony World (TW) for arranging for, and carrying out, repairs to the roof of Q Hangar 5 **GENERAL MANAGER'S POINTS** The GM reported that: Brackets will be made up to support the anti-bird netting to be fitted along the top of the Main Hangar doors He wished to record his thanks to those who helped with the repairs to Q Hangar particularly Jerry Lee, Steve Blundell and Johnny Meon In regard to the intention to refit FUG with its own refurbished wings, this has proved to be not possible so the plan is now to improve the replacement wings currently fitted **OPERATIONS** 6 CFI POINTS: The CFI reported that: The flying of 40 personnel from HMS Collingwood had been particularly rewarding and he wished to thank those who made the event such a success. Just a few points of note for the committee:

- 1. **Fuel:** We recently purchased 15,000 litres of fuel during a price dip which saw oil 30%. Avgas prices have already increased again by 6ppl+VAT (7.2p), which has saved us £1100. However, we believe the fuel price will surge within the next few months and it is expected this will have saved around £3000 over the time period we would otherwise have bought the fuel.
- 2. Instruments: We have received £4500 from RN for instruments. The total amount we will spend on those instruments is:
 - £2000 LX7007 pro IGC for DUO
 - LX7007 rear seat £740+vat (£888)
 - Avionics for tug £4136+vat (£4963)
 - Total: £7851 inc VAT
 - this represents a £1150 saving over the original request for two reasons:
 - i. waiting for the right moment to purchase items at

the best euro rate

- ii. setting up a company to gain authorised dealer status for avionics saving around 15-20% on costs.
- Please can I ask committee members to come and ask me for any avionics / gliding related equipment. I am building up a good repertoire of manufacturer dealerships, items from which can be passed on to the club for a heavily discounted price and certainly cheaper than elsewhere.
- A huge thanks to Tony, Jerry Lee and a few others for some sterling work on Q-hangar roof.
