A background briefing was given, following DD's announcements at the Instructors' meeting, the latter being the day following announcements by FBC that had come as rather a surprise about HCA's handling of the transition to FBC ownership and critical information being concealed between the two public departments. The Chairman had deemed it more important to pass on the information without delay, rather than wait for the Committee meeting and for that he apologised for appearing to be out of sequence.

The gist of this was a concealed covenant added by HCA, which FBC still declines to publish, necessitating PNGC's termination of the current lease (31 Dec 15) with vacant possession of Belman 4 in favour of Britten Norman for reasons which the Council declines to state. While some sympathy could be felt for FBC's position, primarily because the concealed term appeared likely to have been HCA-driven to release a waterfront property which HCA is retaining, the reluctance of FBC to publish the covenants or restrictions were most disappointing, as also was BN's silence

This situation was lined up from long ago when the previous RNGSA Chairman, as a serving officer at the time, had been enjoined by PNGC to ensure proper MOD retention of its stake in the land title. This had not been secured and MOD had subsequently relinquished all title interests.

The current position is of continuing dialogue with FBC towards securing a suitable new lease from 31 Dec 15, which would have been needed anyway. It will be necessary for PNGC to reduce its 'footprint,' which was considered attainable by a number of actions including modernising and rationalising the vehicle and aircraft fleets. Clearly a cost is associated with all of this, as well as external factors and charges over which PNGC has no direct control, or as yet even any visibility. Much evidence was available that the airfield management costs were coming under very heavy scrutiny by FBC and would be re-tendered in due course.

FBC continues to assure PNGC of a long term place at the airfield, however the financial issues require considerable further dialogue and the transition arrangements may be different from the long term position. None of this can begin to emerge until after the Council has published its overarching 'Vision' for the Airfield, which might well differ from HCA's.

The Chairman commented that it has been difficult to sustain arguments with FBC without good records readily available of PNGC's track record to date of training outcomes for the military and civil communities alike. This is seen as a missed opportunity, therefore all reasonable investment of effort was requested to see if we could improve the representation of all that PNGC has achieved over the years as the basis of sustaining its case for continued support under new airfield ownership.

The Chairman was keen to emphasise that the there was all good reason to continue the maximum possible rates of flying, and that where best use was not made of flying opportunities, potentially detrimental precedents might be set and should therefore be avoided.
